### Show Rules:

1. The senior doe and junior does shows are sanctioned separately by the American Dairy Goat Association and its rules shall govern. Only ADGA registered, recorded, or applied for animals may be shown.
2. The shows are sanctioned for the following breeds: Senior Does and Junior Does;  
Alpine, Lamancha, Nubian, Oberhasli, AOP and Recorded Grade Bucks: Nubian, and AOP
3. Any animal exhibiting signs of infectious disease will be disqualified and removed from the show barn. This includes but is not limited to diseases such as pink eye, ring worm, CL Abscesses and any open sores or obvious general unhealthiness.
4. The MDGA will be checking health papers and all animals brought to the show must have been checked by a veterinarian certifying the animals to be free from symptoms of contagious diseases.
5. Bucks are to be housed in a separate area of the barn.
6. The original or duplicate registration certificate is required on animals 6 months of age or over. Kids under 6 months of age may be shown with a stamped duplicate application.
7. Check in for the 4-H/Youth Show is before 6:00 p.m. Friday, and for the ADGA open show, before 7:00 a.m. Saturday, April 28, 2007.
8. The base date for computing age on any animal is the date of the show. Judging will begin at 7:00 p.m. Friday night and at 8:00 a.m. Saturday.
9. Entry fee is \$4.00 per animal for the Youth Show and \$8.00 per animal for the ADGA Shows. Pen fees are \$2.00 per pen for the entire weekend. Please make an effort to send your entries to the show chairman as early as possible so that we can complete the printing of the classes prior to the show. Late entry fees will be \$12.00 per animal.
10. There will be no pre-show milkout.
11. Remember, ADGA requires that all animals to be shown must not have horns. This includes goat kids which must be disbudded.
12. Any owner or exhibitor or persons exhibiting animals who publicly expresses disapproval, in the showring or on the grounds, of the decision of the judge or who by act or interference shall be guilty of conduct unbecoming an exhibitor may be disqualified and be requested to remove themselves and their animals from the grounds. The show chairman and the show secretaries shall have the authority to make this decision.
13. The MDGA will not be held responsible for the safety of persons, animals or personal property.

14. Pens are not to be altered in any way. This is a MS State Fairgrounds rule and must be obeyed.

15. No dogs shall be allowed in the barn or on the show grounds at any time.

16. No smoking is allowed in the barn or the show arena. Please be considerate of others and obey this policy.

17. Parents are strictly liable for the safety and conduct of their children. The show barn is not a ball field or playground and we expect exhibitors and their families to respect the health of all the animals and not create disturbances which may frighten animals thus causing serious injuries.
